The year of 2021 has been another full of challenges.

The Council continue to meet online and look forward to when we can meet in person. However, AIM continues to be active in Australia, the Asia-Pacific and Africa.

The Council of Africa Inland Mission Ltd. (AIM Ltd), oversees AIM in the Asia-Pacific including separate legal entities in Australia, Hong Kong and New Zealand. Council policies set direction and targets for the Asia-Pacific Director and team.

This report gives some results from July 2020 to June 2021.

A driving purpose is to help churches in Australia and the Asia-Pacific participate in Jesus' Great Commission.

AIM Ltd. and our Asia-Pacific partners assist AIM International achieve its goals. These include proclaiming the gospel and making disciples, especially among Africa's unreached peoples.

Council has commenced the search for a new Executive Director with Len about mid-way through his final term.

AIM in Australia and the Asia - Pacific

The year 2020-21 was another of challenges with closed borders, lockdowns, and travel restrictions in Australia, the Asia-Pacific and Africa.

Africa Inland Mission Ltd. continued to support overseas workers and projects, encourage inquiries from prospective workers, inform our supporting churches and individuals, and support and coordinate with our partner organisations in Hong Kong and New Zealand.

The Australia Council, with responsibilities for AIM in Australia and the Asia Pacific, retained their strategic goals or ends. These declare our dependence on the grace and power of the Lord and focus the organisation on:

1. Challenging, educating, and equipping an in-

creasing number of Asia-Pacific churches to participate in the Great Commission.

- 2. Engaging an increasing number of Asia-Pacific Churches in AIM's mission, particularly to unreached African peoples (UPGs).
- 3. Increasing the number of Asia-Pacific Christians working cross-culturally in AIM's mission, primarily focused on unreached African peoples.
- 4. Increasing the number of Christians in the Asia-Pacific praying regularly for the work of AIM.
- 5. Increasing the number of Asia-Pacific Christians and churches committed to the regular financial support of AIM's mission effort.

Across the Asia-Pacific, in 2021, we reported achievement of all ends or strategic goals except 5. Nonetheless, God blessed the finances with an unplanned growth and surplus. Continued on page 3.

Who we are: We are an Australian-based Christian mission working with sister organisations in the Asia-Pacific, Africa and worldwide. What we do: We are focused on engaging the Australian and Asia-Pacific Christian community in the work of establishing Christ-centered churches among all African peoples. Why we do it: We are compelled by the Great Commission from Jesus in the Bible, to go, make disciples of all nations, teaching them all Christ taught his disciples. AIM speakers in the Asia-Pacific presented the challenge of the Great Commission and God's call to His mission to more than 30 churches and Christian groups. In addition, some workers on home assignments in Australia and Hong Kong encouraged churches with updates on their ministry. About 530 churches in Australia and more in New Zealand received the *Africa News*.

AIM engaged more churches by sending information and guest speakers. Churches overall sent an increasing number of workers from the Asia-Pacific, especially in Hong Kong. In Australia, Churches gave \$153,409 toward worker support and projects.

In 2021 there were 29 full-term workers compared to 27 in 2020, comprising 15 from Australia, 11 including two new appointees from Hong Kong, and three from New Zealand. There was no short-term program operating from Australia or New Zealand due to travel difficulties. One short-term served from Hong Kong. We have new full-term applicants in Australia and are praying for more, and one couple is preparing to serve in Madagascar after a leave of absence.

More than 6,600 people received prayer information in 2021, increasing 535 from 2019 and 300 in 2020. More people are receiving prayer material by email and through social media. AIM's prayer website *PrayAfrica.org* remains a valuable source of daily prayer updates and resources on Africa's unreached or least-reached peoples.

In 2021, giving in Australia of \$667,325 came from 36 churches (\$149,160) and 315 individuals (\$459,195) to fund workers support, projects and general funds. An additional \$9,9143 net was transferred to Africa through our tax-deductible partners Global Development Group for *J1076N African Crises Relief*, increasing about \$5,000 compared to 2020. Hong Kong was the only centre showing an increase in supporting churches, with five new churches in Hong Kong supporting workers in 2021.

Thank you to all who have prayed and financially supported AIM, our workers and our projects in 2021. We value your support and enthusiasm for AIM's work.

Overseas Activities 2021

Africa Inland Mission Ltd. focused on its roles in Australia including engaging the Australian Christian Community, and mobilising workers and funds for overseas activities and projects with AIM International. We cooperate with AIM in Hong Kong and New Zealand. However, as part of our responsibilities we annually review activities in Africa. Here are some highlights from the 2021 review.

Projects in Africa

AIM in Australia sent almost \$A12,000 for AIM projects in 2020-2021. Almost \$A5,000 went to two crises relief projects, *International Famine and Crises Relief IO130 and East Africa Famine Relief ER-002-R.* In the calendar year of 2020, *Project IO -130* gave \$US110,158 in emergency relief from floods in Tanzania and Chad; famine in Mozambique, Madagascar and Namibia, and cyclones in Mozambique, and other small relief gifts. *Project ER-002-R* gave \$US28,768 to flood relief in Tanzania and Kenya, drought relief in northern Kenya and Tanzania and food-aid for Bible college staff in the Covid-19 closures.

Other projects supported included *African Missionary Assistance* (\$A1945); *Safina Street Network* (\$A1,600) and *AIM-Air operations* (\$A1,000). From 10/7/20 to 9/7/21, our partners Global Development Group transferred tax-deductible funds of \$A9,0145.93 for *J1076N African Crises Relief.* These funds were used for similar purposes to *Project ER-002-R*.

Workers and Activities in Africa

There were 30 full-term workers from the Asia-Pacific currently serving in Africa or on leave or home assignments in 2021. This number includes 16 from Australia, 11 including two appointees from Hong Kong, and three from New Zealand.

AIM in Australia sent \$A167,109 to Africa as allowances and \$A32,114.63 as work funds for Australian workers. Funds were paid to workers in Australia and held as benefits for those overseas. AIM in Australia also received support gifts for eight families or single workers from other mobilising regions.

A survey of all workers receiving support from Australia found the primary activity of 70% of respondents was disciple making among unreached people. Respondents recorded a high impact of Covid on their ministries. Impacts included contracting Covid, and not being able to meet with communities or travel.

The AIM International Vision 2020 ended in Decem- About 70% of our Asia-Pacific workers live and work ber 2020. We praise God for the remarkable things He caused to happen. In 2020, 1730 new disciples were born among African unreached people groups, with 8,358 new disciples reported since 2016.

As the table above shows, many targets were exceeded during the six-year vision. Many Africans have been mobilised into mission via AIM, African churches and organisations.

Australian and Asia-Pacific workers comprise a small but significant part of the AIM International team.

Australian and New Zealanders serve among the Karamojong in Uganda, while others work among the Didinga and Lopit people of South Sudan. Workers in Tanzania help make disciples of Christ among the Nyamwezi and workers serve the people of north Africa, the Horn of Africa and Chad. Workers in Rwanda and Kenya are among those training Africans and equipping some of the 11,411 church leaders or 441 Africans mobilised into missional disciple making.
