# Paul & Phyllis Barnett

Paul was born in Kenya as a twin to John. He graduated from RVA attending there 11 years after which he attended Wheaton College and graduated from Moody. Phyllis was born in Lancaster Pa and graduated from The Reading Hospital and Lancaster Bible College. Later Paul graduated from Millersville Univ. with a degree in Industrial Arts. They were married May 29, 1965. Paul then graduated from Penn State University with his Master's degree in Education. They attended Missionary Internship for 9 mos where their first daughter was born. In Sept 1967 they arrived at RVA where they served for 25 years.



The first 9 years they were dorm parents for high school boys. Paul also coached Varsity soccer, taught SS, was SS supervisor, dorm supervisor and maintenance supervisor. He started the Shop program and together they sponsored 5 classes and had many Caring Communities. Phyllis taught SS, played the organ, played for the RVA choir and Sunday services. She worked as a nurse at the Kijabe hospital and taught in the nursing school. The last few years she was RVA school nurse.



They have 4 children, Sharon, Karen, Kristen and Michael. They returned to the states in 1992 and in 1997 came to Media where Paul was maintenance supervisor. 
