

## MEET SOME OF THE MISSIONARIES

Peggy was born and raised in a Christian home but found Christ as her personal Savior at the age of eight while attending a Christian camp. At the age of twelve, at another Christian camp, Peggy gave her life to the Lord for service to wherever and whatever God was to lead her. Peggy graduated from Trinity College and then went on to the University of South Florida and received a B.A. in Library/English Education and a M.A. in Library/Audiovisual Education. She worked for three years in the public school system in Polk County, Florida, as a media specialist, to gain some needed experience. The Lord then led Peggy to Kenya, East Africa, where she spent 12 years, first working at Rift Valley Academy as a librarian, dorm parent, and English teacher.

Peggy also spent one year in Nairobi doing flight scheduling, assigning cargo and passengers to the flights, and purchasing supplies for missionaries living outside urban areas.

Peggy returned to the United States in 1984, on what she thought was a furlough; the Lord had other plans. For eleven years, she was Director of Library Services at Trinity College. She helped plan and implement the library into a brand new facility and merged a 20,000 volume library from a college similar to Trinity in its purpose into Trinity's collection. After growing up at Trinity as her father taught there, graduating from there and then working there, Trinity was "home" to her as no other place. In 1994 Peggy moved to Keswick Christian School in Seminole, Florida where she served for six years as the school librarian for a K3-12 school. In 2000 Peggy went to a brand new Christian high school Clearwater, Florida under the auspices of Calvary Baptist Church. Her responsibilities there included teaching English, creative writing, Bible, journalism, which included the student newsletter and the yearbook class, and photography. In 2010 Peggy moved to Media. She is serving voluntarily as librarian at Media, an instructor with Crossroads Bible Institute in their prison ministry, a volunteer in the little public library in Minneola, and teaching English as a Second Language in the community. It's all about knowing Him and making Him known.

home was Elizabeth, NJ. They met while attending Houghton College and together went to Congo in 1954 where they spent 25 years. Carl was involved as Teacher, Principal, Advisor to National School Supt. and Gladys as Mom/housewife along with teaching and women's work. They are currently residing in Scott Manor. They have three children: Carl, Peggy, John; 4 grandchildren and 2 great grandchildren.


