Following further training at Greenville College, she applied to Sudan Interior Mission. #### Dick and Flo Gehman in Kenya

"God opened the way for us to return to Kenya for two months of ministry when invited to speak at the graduation services of Kapsabet Bible College on March 23 and at Scott Christian University on June 4. In between Dick spoke at A.I.C. Ziwani and A.I.C. Mathare Valley, both in Nairobi; Dick taught sixty Masai pastors in Narok during one Saturday; he also preached in Narok A.I.C., Maingi (Kijabe) A.I.C., Bomani A.I.C. (Machakos), and Kabarak University Chapel. Flo taught forty women at Maingi AIC where she used to conduct a Bible Study. In order to gather information on the A.I.C. history, Dick interviewed nearly two dozen individuals and photocopied hundreds of historical documents. Hopefully, this will all contribute to the writing of a book on the history of the Africa Inland Church in Kenya with an emphasis on the role of Kenyans in the planting and building of the A.I.C."
