








Sweetwaters Tented Camp. (B, L, D)


Nairobi — After breakfast, leave for the Kajiado Center for Maasai children with disabilities. Return to Nairobi where you will have lunch at The Veranda Utamaduni Restaurant where you'll witness some of Kenya's diverse bird life attracted to the restaurant's lush garden. The remainder of the afternoon you will visit with the staff of Tumaini Counseling Centre, one of AlM's support ministries. Dinner with missionary guests and overnight stay in Nairobi at the Laico Regency Hotel. (B,L,D).

Day 4

Sunday, January 26

Nairobi - Ol Pejeta Conservancy

After breakfast depart Nairobi to Sweetwaters. The drive passes the small industrial town of Thika surrounded by extensive pineapple and tea plantations. The terrain is on the ascent to the rich farmland of the highlands where one sees coffee growing. You will arrive in time for lunch at the Camp. Enjoy an afternoon game drive at the OI Pejeta Conservancy and chimpanzee sanctuary. This 70,000-acre private preserve has views of the peaks of Mount Kenya and offers game drives into countryside many travelers never see. The OI Pejeta Conservancy and its sumptuous ranch was once the private domain of famed multi-millionaire Adam Kashogqi. This conservancy hosts a variety of African wildlife. Dinner and overnight at Sweetwaters Tented Camp. (B, L, D)

Day 6

Tuesday, January 28

Ol Pejeta Conservancy

You will enjoy a day of leisure and rest! Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner will be served at Sweetwaters Tented Camp. There will be a time of fellowship and devotion with tour guests and tour guides during the late afternoon prior to dinner. Wednesday, January 29

Sopa Lodge Naivasha

After breakfast depart for Sopa Lodge Naivasha set in one hundred and fifty acres of grassland studded with Acacia bushes and trees. Enjoy lunch viewing Thompson's Falls with an altitude of 7,738 feet. Proceed to Sopa Lodge Naivasha. The resort is not only home to resident giraffe, waterbuck and both Vervet and Colobus monkeys, but it is also a night stop for the hippos when they leave the lake every night to come and trim the grass on the lodge's expansive lawn. Day 8

Thursday, January 30

Sopa Lodge Naivasha

After breakfast, depart and drive to Kijabe, stopping at the AIM's Children's Feeding Center en route. Spend the remainder of the day visiting the Rift Valley Academy where you will enjoy lunch with students and missionaries. Later, visit Moffat Bible College and Kijabe Medical Center. The ministries at Kijabe serve some 80 different mission organizations in Africa. Return to Sopa Lodge for dinner and overnight. (B,L,D)

Day 9

Friday, January 31

Sopa Lodge Naivasha

After breakfast, depart for Eburru, a mountain between Gilgil and Naivasha. There you will meet a group of Dorobo hunters and take a short hike with them into the forest. Our missionary hosts, Shel and Kym Arensen, have worked with the Dorobo for many years, and will introduce us to some of the unique cultural aspects of this people group, including bee keeping practices and the harvesting of traditional medicines. We will have a picnic lunch in the forest among our Dorobo hosts. We will then enjoy a brief service at a Dorobo church and meet with some Dorobo believers. Dinner and overnight at Sopa Lodge Naivasha.

Day 10

Saturday, February 1

Sopa Lodge Naivasha - Maasai Mara National Reserve

After breakfast, depart for Maasai Mara National Reserve, arriving at your camp in time for lunch. After lunch, you will embark for an afternoon game drive at this majestic and scenic reserve. Maasai Mara National reserve is the Northern extension of the Serengeti National Reserve. With rolling grass fields, the scenic reserve is home to Kenya's big five (lion, elephant, cape buffalo, leopard, and rhinoceros), and with over 500 species of birds, it's also a bird watchers' haven. Overnight at Sarova Mara Game Camp, which offers an unparalleled range of activities and experiences including a unique insight into Maasai culture at the Camp's adjoining Maasai village. (B, L, D)

Day 11

Sunday, February 2

Maasai Mara National Reserve — Early morning game viewing of Kenya's array of wildlife in their natural habitat. More than 60 species of animals are found here as well as myriad of birds. The vegetation is generally savanna type with clumps of trees near water holes. These supply shade as well as foliage to elephants. The rivers are lined with gallery forest. The acacias supply the Maasai giraffe with their favorite food. After a game drive, back to the lodge for your breakfast, followed by a morning of leisure. Enjoy lunch followed by an afternoon game drive. This trip could be very rewarding as one is most likely to see lion enjoying a kill. The game reserve is noted for its black maned lion. Dinner and overnight at Sarova Mara Game Camp. (B, L, D)





Day 12

Monday, February 3

Maasai Mara National Reserve — Nairobi

After breakfast at your lodge, you'll return to Nairobi via AIM AIR. Upon arrival at Wilson Airport, Nairobi, we will visit AIM AIR, AIM Serve, two of AIM's Support Service ministries. Lunch at Java House and then a drive to Mayfield Guesthouse for check-in. Dinner at Osteria Del Chianti in Nairobi with missionary quests. (B,L,D)

Day 13

Tuesday, February 4

Nairob.

After breakfast at leisure, we'll visit AlM's Eastern Region office and join them for prayer time, after which, we'll depart for Giraffe Centre where you'll get a chance to feed these amazing creatures. Lunch is own arrangements. After excursions, transfer back to Mayfield Guest House to freshen up. You will later be transferred to Brazilian Steakhouse, Fogo Gaucho for dinner. Return to Mayfield Guest House for your overnight stay.

Accommodations: Based on two or more persons sharing a room in accommodations listed in itinerary, or similar. Single rooms are subject to availability at an additional charge. If a passenger cannot supply a roommate, the passenger is responsible for the additional charge.

Meals: In-flight meals and snacks are served according to airline policy. Meals will be provided as indicated in the itinerary by B=Breakfast, L=Lunch, and D=Dinner. Beverages are not included for all meals.

Transfers and Baggage: Transfers between airports and hotels upon arrival and departure are included in the tour price, including handling of one medium-sized suitcase per person, not exceeding 62 dimensional inches (length plus width plus height) or weighing more than a maximum of 50 pounds. Due to limited luggage storage space on motor coaches, it is important that each person bring only ONE piece of checked baggage. In addition, a flight bag or overnight case may be taken, which must be handled by the passenger at all times. Baggage allowance is subject to change according to airline policy

Sightseeing and Entrance Fees: Are included as indicated in itinerary, using private motor coach or safari vehicle, with local safari driver/guides where necessary.

Tips and Taxes: Service charges and taxes on accommodations, and tips to guides, drivers, and

hotel staff are included. Tips for personal services are not included.

Not Included: Beverages are not included for all meals. Passport fee, travel protection insurance, checked baggage fees, Visa, and expenses of a purely personal nature are not included. Transportation from your home to departure city and return is not included. (See Passport, Visa & Health Requirements regarding Visa).

Balloon ride, Entry to Maasai tribal village, personal shopping money are not included.

Visit www.Kenyalmmigration.org to obtain your e-visa. Non-U.S. citizens are responsible to fulfill entry requirements for countries to be visited

by contacting the appropriate consulates. No inoculations are required, but please check with your physician for his recommendation.
